

Transportation of Westview Children to Borden Street School to Close After April

The aggrieved question of transportation of Section Two children in busses to Borden Street School was again under discussion at last night's school board meeting. The board decided to continue the service until after the Easter holiday at least.

The question came up when the board was informed that J. E. Dyer had insisted on being paid at least \$1 for each trip and 5c extra for each child over 20 that was carried. Mr. Dyer stated that he could not possibly operate the service under a minimum of \$1 for each trip.

Trustee Weldon McAfee thought that children who had to travel all the way from Seal Cove to Booth! School were as much entitled to a IS WEICOME from Section Two.

Trustee J. H. Thompson was inclined to think the service might be discontinued as he felt the money would be much better spent on playgrounds. It would also be necessary to paint Borden Street School and he wondered where the money was going to be secured.

Mrs. T. M. Spencer, chairman, also thought that the service might be discontinued. Forty dollars month was a great deal to be paying for it.
