Lady Superintendent and Dr. Cade Reply to Mr. Dibb

A proposal of Frank Dibb that something should be done to alleviate the disadvantages under which he believed night nurses labored as compared with members of the day staff did not meet with favor at last night's meeting of the hospital board. Explanations made by Miss Jean Harrison R. N., lady superintendent, and Dr. J. P. Cade revealed that there was no material disadvantage as far as the night nurse was concerned and that, in many ways, her duties were lighter

than those of the day nurse. In the trades, Mr. Dibb pointed out, night work was usually less desirable and, as a general rule, higher wages were paid and hours were less than in day work. In the hospital there was no distinction and, indeed, he understood that the night nurses really had longer hours than those on day duty.

Miss Harrison stated that the night nurses actually did not work longer hours nor so hard. As a matter of fact, there was not the work to be attended to at night, when most patients were asleep, that arose in the day such as dressings, meals, attending the doctors, looking after visitors and, what was most difficult of all, watching the work of the students. Executive ability and experience was required by the day staff nurse while a young graduate could usually get along quite nicely at night.

As far as this hospital was concerned, Miss Harrison stated that it was usual for each night nurse to have a night off a week and she questioned if there were many hospitals in the province where this was done regularly. It was the idea to keep the night staff up to a strength of four in order to assure hours and nights off duty.

In answer to a question, Miss Harrison stated that the system of switching nurses between day and night duty was not practiced in any hospital that assumed to any standing and certainly not in training schools. Constant efficiency could not be ensure by doing this. There was no one more anxious than herself to do the right thing by the night 'nurses, Miss; Harrison declared.

Asked for an opinion on the matter, Dr. J. P. Cade stated that there was much less work at night and by no means the responsibility carried by nurses of the day staff who, besides their other work, as a matter of fact laid out the night routine. There was no extra work at night except in cases of emer-

gency. The hardest worked nurses in the Queen Charlotte City. hospital, Miss Harrison felt, were the members of the operating room

In answer to a statement by Ald. Macdonald to the effect that the general opinion was that the nurses were overworked, Miss Harrison stated that she did not believe this to be a fact while there were busy Hunt's Furniture & Upholstry to be a fact. While there were busy times on occasion, the practice as far as possible was to keep hours of work reasonable and give time off regularly. The staff, as a whole, appeared happy and contented, showed no signs of overwork and she did not believe that the hospital was understaffed.
