By the new, up-to-date police signal system which Toronto officially took over the other day, with considerable ceremony, the Police Department is enabled to transmit a description of a stolen car, hold-up man or bandit to every man on his beat; this new system is also available for service every moment of the night or day for the conduct of ordinary routine business and communication of orders. The system is spread over the entire 32.8 square miles of city area, and is divided into twelve police divisions.
