

### Prospector Found Dead Head Was Riddled With Bullets From Murderer

Believed to Have Been Shot In Revenge For Having Discovered That His Friend Had Been Victim Immediately Previous

CORDOVA, Alaska, Dec. 27:—Another mystery death in the McCarthy district was reported when Dan Person, prospector, was found dead in his cabin with his head riddled with bullets. He is the sixth man to have been found dead under mysterious circumstances in lonely cabins in the region in recent months. The victim immediately preceding Person was Novard Foster.

Although a corner's jury returned a verdict of suicide in the case of Foster, Person insisted that his friend had been murdered.

The authorities now believe that Person may have been murdered in revenge by Foster's slayer.
