"Intuition," she said, "means the recognition of truth at sightthere is no argument over it. We have observed this working out in the California schools. where teachers have had difficulty teaching the intuitive children and others in the same classes. The intuitive children are as a rul two and a half years older in intelligence than the others. This characteristic has been observed at a very early age.

"Judging from the chaos in sex relations. America is breaking away toward a higher ideal. this process there must be an enset, but this is very important for the future. takes time to work out." The selection of the colonists is not to be made exclusively from the ranks of Theosophists. Dr. Besant is not particular about creed as she is about the very practical details of actual behavior-the use of tact and good judgment, ability to perform useful work, and the knack of getting along well with family and neighbors. With such people she feels certain it will be possible to have a very nice, cozy cooperative colony in which there will be very little possessive sense. either as to persons or property. and a great deal of social responsibility.

Not only will the economic tendency of industrial society toward; acquisition be greatly weakened. but jealousy in personal relationships will cease entirely to be a virtue. The industry conducted by the colony will be for the purpose of use and not for amassing wealth -although it is thoroughly understood that wealth will have its useful place in the community.
