finitions, unless requested to do so, in subsequent letters or publications.

Capitalism

Capitalism is an historical and progressive epoch in the course of human life, distinguishable from the preceding ones, by the apparent free wage labor, and the production and distribution of the necessities of life for the exclusive purpose of profit.

Capitalism, as a system has its own philosophy, which is not scientific (as the apology under discussion discloses) and has been evolved for the purpose of justifying the capitalistic mode of production, under which, exploitation of man by man has continued from the time of the evolution of private property in the means of production, till the present day.

Capitalism came into existence when economic conditions were ripe for its appearance (the conditions which were evolved during the feudal times) and capitalism would naturally go out of use, if not artificially prolonged, when conditions develop pre-requisite to the establishment of socialism.

While I am not in the position to predict the time when this change will occur, it is obvious that a certain degree of socialization in the productive and distributing industries, will have to be reached, ere the transformation becomes inevitable.

It is more or less known that human behavior is reaction to the stimuli of environment, and when socialism is under discussion, this factor, perhaps unconsciously and unscientifically, is associated with the conception of the superiority of socialistic ethics over those of capitalism.

Sees Improvement

The correct inference to be deduced from this is, that under the influence of a morally higher motive, namely production for use, human morals and general behavior is bound to improve.

Here the sophistry of the capitalistic philosophy reveals itself in an unscientific inference, consisting in the perversion of the above factors, and an erroneous conclusion that, socialism is based on, or conditioned by, a higher type of human nature than exists at present.

As stated before, the evolution of socialism from capitalism is regulated by the presence of ripe economic conditions, while now I may add, that like Darwin, with his methodical selection, Marx makes allowance for human interference, with the otherwise natural conditions, emanating from the factors involved. This human interference may act both ways. It may retard the progress of humanity, as per the apologists for capitalism, though perhaps not realizing it, or it may accelerate the rate of progress, as organized labor in the industrial and political field, is striving to do.
