BIG BANQUET AT ALICE ARM

Commercial Club of Mining Centre About Sixty in Number enjoy Festive Repast.

The dining room of the Alice Arm Hotel was the scene of one of the most enjoyable social events in the history of the camp, when the Alice Arm Commercial Club gave its second annual banquet and dance last Friday evening. Covers were laid for sixty persons at tables where the decorative scheme was carried out with a profusion of beautiful roses, carnations, chrysanthemums and ferns, a sight to warm the hearts of men who had just returned from a season spent in the hills. The banquet room was filled and the guests voted the affair an event worthy of an older and more settled community.

Toastmaster.
Vice-President O. Evindsen, of the Commercial Club, acted as toastmaster and with his genial mannerisms and witty remarks kept the faces of all wreathed in smiles as he performed his duties as Master of Ceremonies. Between the remarks and speeches of the others he filled in with the relation of anecdotes of amusing occurrences in the early days of the camp. Mr. Evindsen was one of the original owners of the famous Dolly Varden mine, which has made the name of Alice Arm known in mining circles all over the United States and Canada. He is, therefore, in a position to talk instructively and authentically on the history of the camp as he was practically the father of it.

Major Davis.
Major A. W. Davis, superintendent of the Taylor Mining Co. at Alice Arm and who is in charge of the railroad and mining operations there, gave a very spirited address. He expressed himself as being most optimistic as to the future of the district. In time the Alice Arm country will be one of the world's greatest silver producers.

E. E. Campbell, mine superintendent for the Granby Co. at Anxox, made a special trip to the Arm for the occasion. He has followed operations at Alice Arm carefully ever since the development and exploitation of the district was commenced and remarked that no person could imagine what wealth would be taken out of the hills in the district. He had untrammelled confidence in its productiveness.

Mr. Peterson, another Granby official, expressed his confidence in the camp.

Aggressiveness Needed.
G. A. Young, government road supervisor for the Atlin district, spoke at some length and gave some good advice to the Commercial Club. He believed in these organizations for the obtaining of improvements for a locality and the advertisement of it. He believed, however, that the importance of the district warranted a lot more aggressiveness on the part of the members if they desired to make the rapid progress of development in public improvements and conveniences that the present indications at the mines justified.

After the banquet, dancing was enjoyed until the wee sma' hours of the morning when the guests betook themselves homeward with happy thoughts of a night spent well in festivities over the past achievements and future prospects of the camp.

DOG TEAMS FOR DOLLY VARDEN

Canines Being Secured for Winter Use From Hazelton and Naas River.

Anticipating the tying up of the railroad for a few months in the winter, the Taylor Mining Co. are making provision for the taking of supplies and mail to the Dolly Varden mine during that time. Thus development work will be enabled to go on during the winter months preparatory to renewed shipping in the spring. Mail Carrier Langley has been engaged by the company and has recently been in Hazelton where he has been getting dogs which he will use for taking mail and freight from the beach to the mine, a distance of 18 miles. A regular daily service will probably be established.
