## Possibilities of Thought Exchange.

The article on Thought Exchange by Archbishop Du Vernet published in yesterday's News was the subject of a good deal of comment last evening. It is a subject of general interest and one to which most people have given some attention. It is a subject on which we know so little because, as the Bishop says, "One mind must be in harmony with the other in rhythmic attention," and harmony is difficult to obtain. Much of life is discord, and especially in the relations of one person with the other.

Possibly some day mental telepathy will have been developed to such an extent that it will replace the telephone or telegraph. It is quite as reasonable to think that people might communicate with each other without an instrument of any kind as with the wireless sending and receiving units. It has been done, as the Archbishop says, and let us once discover the secret of using it at will, of subordinating the telepathic power to our own personality and of calling on it at any time as a means of communicating with our friends, and the human race would move forward an immense step at one bound.

Imagine what it would mean if our wives knew all we were thinking about and if the husbands knew where and with whom their wives were associating and what they were talking and thinking about. Imagine what would be the effect on the social life of the community if the young lady knew and understood the thoughts of her lover and if the young man could read the innermost emotions of the girl he proposed to take for a wife.

Much of the evil is the result of secrecy. It is that barrier between mind and mind that gives opportunity for duplicity, with all that the word implies. Perhaps in the next life this barrier will be removed and men and women will read the thoughts of their associates and their friends. Perhaps, too, they are now able to read the thoughts of those who are still on earth.

It has been suggested that the coming of the millennium means the coming of the time when we shall find it possible to communicate by exchange of thoughts rather than by exchange of words. If it does, what a lot of inane chatter will be eliminated. Welcome the time!

## Shall We Fly to Vancouver Soon?

The Aerial League of Canada sees an opportunity to establish an air service between this city and Vancouver, presumably calling at points en route. The matter will be up for discussion at the meeting of the Board of Trade tomorrow evening in the City Council Chamber.

Only recently the matter of an air service was suggested by J. F. Maguire but the committee of the Board to whom it was referred after inquiry, came to the conclusion that it was not at present feasible, and the subject was dropped. Now it crops up again and will continue to be a live subject until such a route is established. It is probable, however, that before it can be put on a sound commercial basis it will have to be taken in hand by the Railway Company and run as part of that system. It would be a great thing to be able to offer tourists to the coast a choice of routes after arriving at Prince Rupert. To fly over the islands and inlets would induce hundreds to come this way instead of taking the C. P. R. It should not be long before the air route from here to Vancouver is the most popular there is.

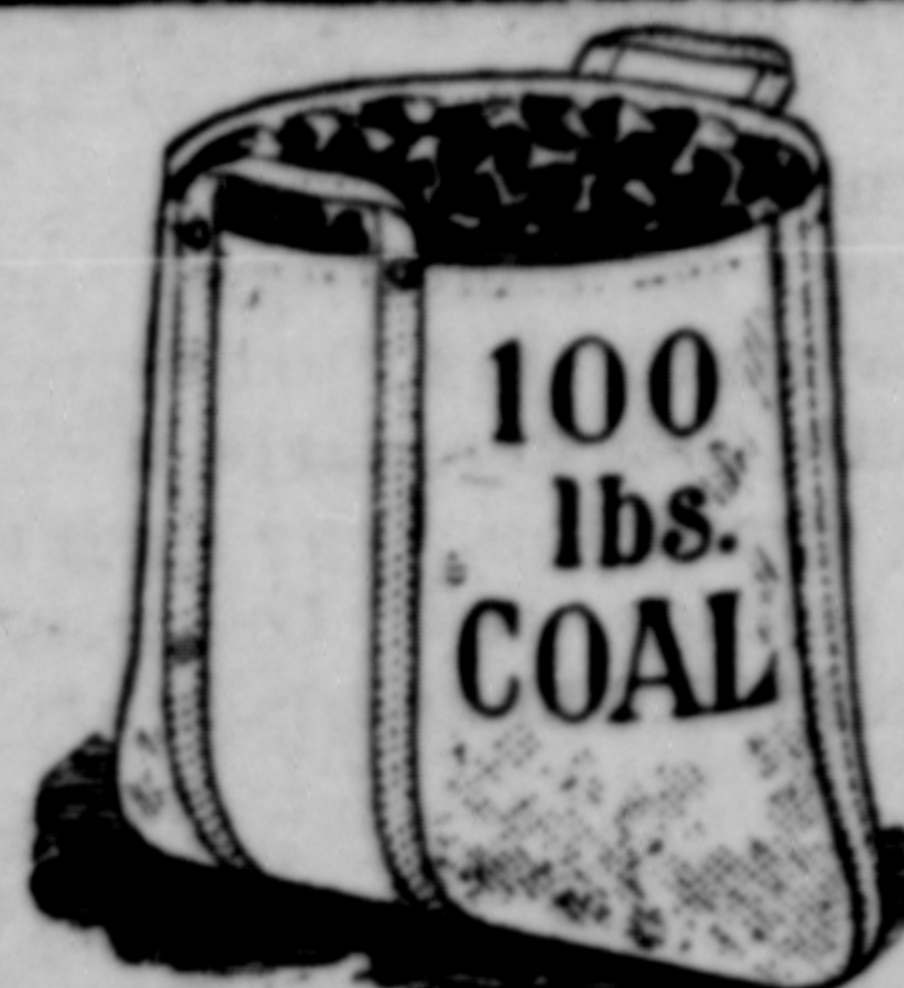
