SUMMARY OF WORK OF LANDS DEPARTMENT

Interim Report Issued at Victoria Showing Large Amount of Useful Work.

VICTORIA, Nov. 6.—While it may not be construed as anything more than an interim report and not intended as a document for presentation to the Legislature, a brief statistical summary dealing with the administration of the various branches of the Provincial Department of Lands affords information of general interest. In authorizing an abridged reference for publication the Hon. T. D. Pattullo emphasizes the fact that by reason of the somewhat ambitious nature of a number of policies adopted by this department, time has been required to elapse in order to provide their tangible justification.

Company Failures.

It is pointed out that not a little difficulty presented itself before an effective method of handling the peculiar conditions of the dry belt could be evolved with promise of success. Boom day land companies which had become possessors of large areas of irrigable lands had failed in their obligations. The sale of land at high prices with "water delivered" had netted them fine profits, while the fruit grower reaped his own particular crop of water difficulties by reason of failure on the part of the water companies to carry out their part of the bargain. The only solution, therefore, deemed capable of relieving increasingly serious conditions was direct assistance to the producer.

The Conservation Fund.

One result of that decision was an amendment to the Water Act providing a Conservation Fund of \$2,000,000 to be drawn upon at the rate of \$500,000 per annum if circumstances demanded that amount of annual assistance. By extending statutory authority for the formation of water users' communities to take over and operate irrigation works under a policy of Government assistance, it became obvious that nothing short of such a course would meet the case. Hence, in the report referred to it is shown that assistance has been rendered in the case of Peachland to the extent of \$12,000; Naramata, \$35,000; Scotty Creek, \$13,000, and Rutland, \$3,000. In these districts the community has organized itself and existing works are being repaired and renewed under expert supervision.

Province Gets Money Back.

Of the larger concerns, for instance, it is pointed out that \$44,000 has been loaned to the White Valley Irrigation and Power Company because its service is essential to the water users of the community, while the company itself was not in a position to finance the necessary repairs incident to that service. Similarly in the case of the Kelowna Irrigation Company, \$20,000 has been loaned from the Conservation Fund under like conditions, while as security for the Province's investment in both cases the Government holds it as a first charge against the whole of the property of the company as well as the revenue of the undertaking itself. It will thus be seen that although the outlays involved are not inconsiderable, the capital is amply secured and the investment made revenue producing from the commencement.

Applications Coming In. And as tribute to the success of

the scheme it is observed that there are twenty applications for assistance now being dealt with according to their merit and relative importance. From this section of the report, therefore, it will be seen that the Department is following out a policy tantamount to Government ownership and Government control rolled into one. Involved legal positions, however, necessarily impose limitations and until a number of cases are shaken down to a more practical level Government acquisition on a wholesale scale would be bad business for the province and of no effective benefit to the individual water user. It is noted, by the way, that thorough investigations are being carried out in respect of all interests involved.

Aeroplane Spruce.

Another interesting phase of the Department's work is that dealing with the effects of the Aeroplane Spruce Cutting Act—a measure passed by the Legislature for the purpose of removing all obstacles to rapid recovery of a commodity urgently needed by the Royal Air Force. The figures themselves are eloquent of the success accomplished. From the time the Order-in-Council passed the Provincial Executive in January of last year—and the legislation passed a couple of months later, was merely of a confirmatory nature—until the end of October, just eight months afterwards, 26,124,000 feet of spruce and 9,224,000 feet of fir had been cut and shipped. In other words, this amount represented sufficient timber to build 20,000 aeroplanes.

Forest Revenue.

Nor is the least interesting part of the Minister's interim summary that section dealing with comparative forest revenue for the last four years ending September 30 of this year. It is shown, for instance, that for the year, 1911 the total figure stood at \$1,851,000. This grew in 1917 to \$2,094,000; in 1918 to \$2,472,000 and for the year which closed on September 30 last, the figures reached \$2,735,000. While to the general administration of the Department—whose normal cost of administration, it should be remarked, has not increased—is ascribed some of the more favorable (continued on Page Four.)
