Use and Storage.
Take notice that Northern British Columbia Power Company Limited whose address is Besner Block, Prince Rupert, B.C., will apply for a license to take and use 1,000 C.F.S. and to store 370,000 acre feet of water out of Meiadin Lake and Meiadin River, which flows southwesterly and drains into the Naas River about 115 miles above tidewater and 69 miles from Aiyansh, B.C.
The storage-dam will be located at about 8 chains above Govt. fish ladder in Lot No. 2450.

The capacity of the reservoir to be created is about 370,000 acre feet, and it will flood about 6,000 acres of land. The water will be diverted from the stream at a point near the storage dam and will be used for power purpose upon the lands described as Parkland Canal Mining Division.

This notice was posted on the ground on the 21st day of March, 1930.

A copy of this notice and an application pursuant thereto and to the "Water Act" will be filed in the office of the Water Recorder at Prince Rupert, B.C.
