what our company does this year; will depend very much upon what the market does," comments J. B. Shallenberger, of the Alaska Sea Food Products Company. "We put up 5,300 barrels of Scotch cured herring last season, but still have about half of them to dispose of. They are fine fish, running 350 to 400 to the barrel, and we ought to let go of them at present prices. The future of the Alaska herring business seems to me to be uncertain. We cannot compete with Europe in the matter of labor and freight rates—it costs approximately \$6.50 to lay a barrel of our fish down in New York, as against \$2.00 from Europe."

This company built a saltery 200 by 40 feet last season, in addition to constructing mess and bunk houses. Everything is in shape for resuming operations this season, if the market warrants.

IS SUPERINTENDENT OF EDUCATION NOW

S. J. Willis, the new superintendent of Education, appointed a few days ago is Canadian born and a graduate of McGill University. While principal of the Victoria High School he conducted the first two years' work of the McGill class and left that position to become associate professor of classics at the University of B. C. He held that position for about eighteen months and then went to King Edward as supervising principal. Dr. Robinson has been superintendent of education for nearly two decades. He was the successor of the late Dr. S. D. Pope. A Dalhousie man. Dr. Robinson came to Vancouver thirty years ago. He was principal of the old Central School, at Cambie and Pender streets, and about 1891 became principal of Vancouver's only high school. He held that position until he moved to Victoria.

How to Finance Victory Bonds

FARMERS:

In the case of farmers, and others who do not receive returns until the end of season, bank managers are empowered to make loans against the 1919 Victory Bond issue for the period of one year, without requiring periodical reductions to be made in the interim.

BUSINESS MEN:

All business men may finance their Victory Loan purchases through their local bank, up to at least 90 per cent. of their purchases, without impairing their ordinary credits with the bank.

EMPLOYEES:

All bond purchases of employees may be financed by the employer through his local bank, up to 90 per cent. of the amount of the purchase. Weekly or monthly payments on account of purchase may be arranged through the employer.

INDIVIDUALS:

Anyone may purchase 1919 Victory Bonds on ten monthly instalments, by paying 10 per cent., and filling out an instalment card. These cards are handed to the bank specified by the purchaser, and the payments during the ten-month period paid in to the bank.

POWER OF LOCAL BANK EXTENDED:

By arrangement between the Finance Minister and the Canadian Bankers' Association, it is announced that where branch managers have a loaning limit for their branches, such limits are to be disregarded insofar as they may be affected by advances to finance 1919 Victory Loan subscriptions.
