## KING SALMON ARE NOT AS LARGE AS THEY FORMERLY WERE

An Alaska mild-cure operator who has recently returned from the Baranof Island district reports that considerable alarm is felt in that vicinity in regard to the increased percentage of small fish caught there this season as compared to previous years. Although the mild cure pack has been on about the same scale as last year in the Barandof district it has been estimated that out of every hundred King Salmon caught only ten weighed over twenty pounds while the balance average around eight pounds MONEY AT 8 PER CENT on buildach. As a result large quantities of fish are destroyed which; left in the water, would develope to a profitable size.


