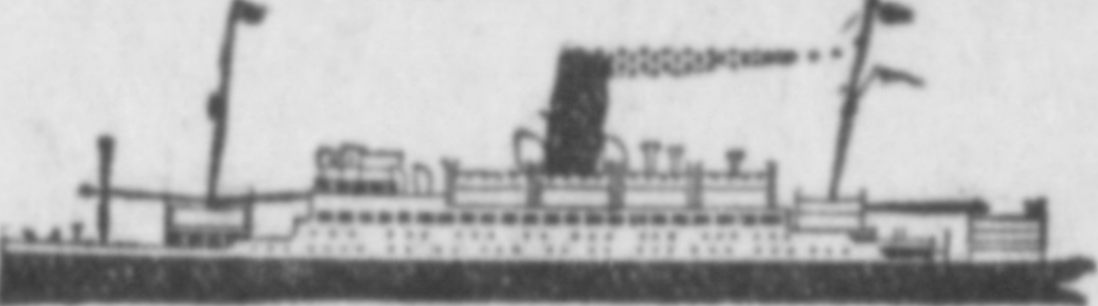
C.N.R. steamer Prince Charles
