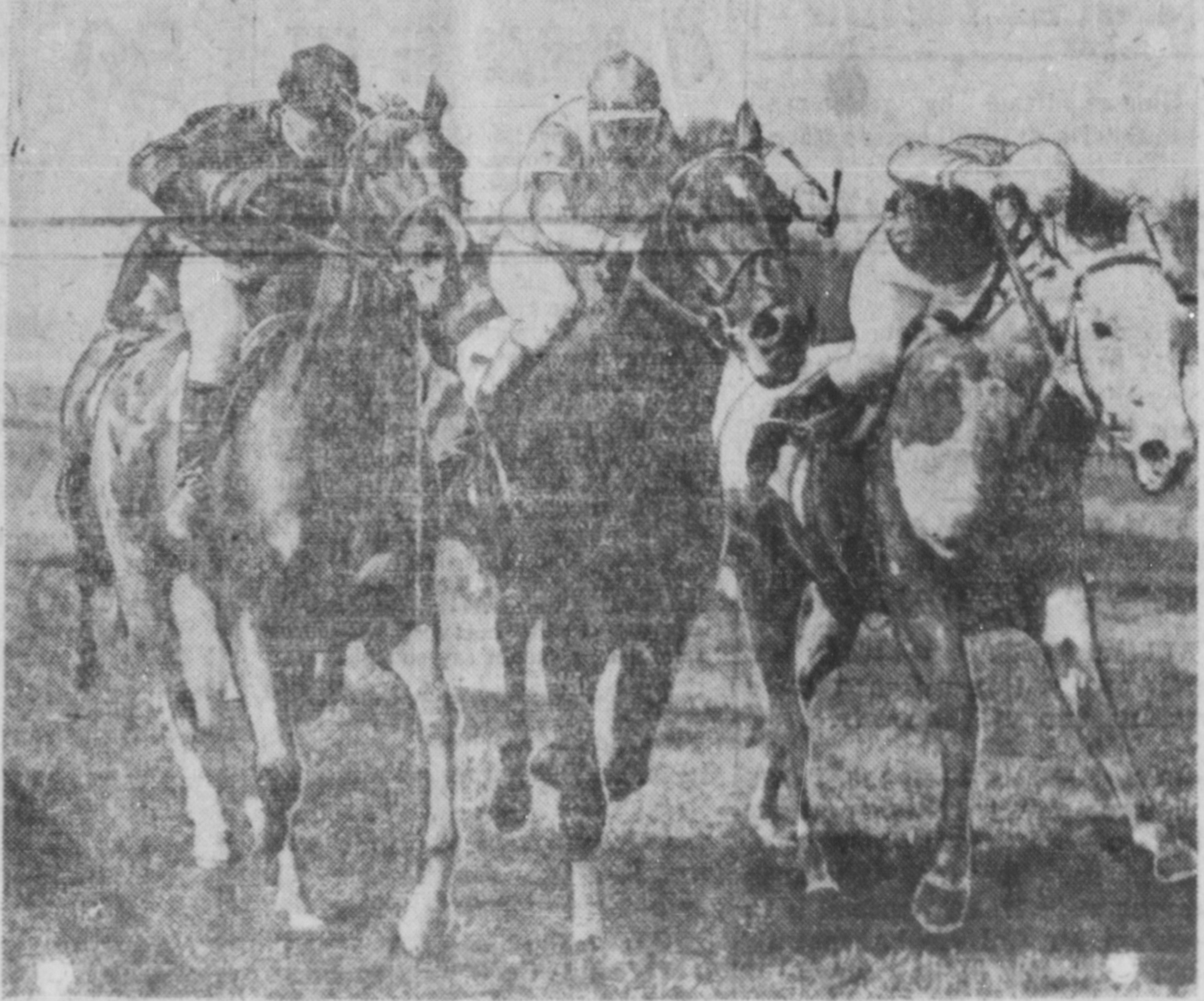

NEW YORK, Sept. 29:—Another record breaking major league baseball season came to an end yesterday, leaving Philadelphia Athletics, the American League winners and St. Louis Cardinals, the National League titleholders, to carry on the battle for the world's championship.

The Cards, after yesterday's contest with Pittsburg Pirates which they won six to one, entrained at St. Louis for Philadelphia where they will meet the Mackmen confident of winning the World Series. The Athletics, however, are just as confident of retaining the title. The first game will be played at Philadelphia on Wednesday.
