James Buckham Kennedy, Dead in New Westminster, Was Real Old Timer of Province

The late James Buckham Kennedy, pioneer of New Westminster, whose death was reported yesterday, was a lumber merchant Ho was born in 1844 in Ottawa when that city was known by its original name of Bytown and was educated in the public schools of the old Ontario town.

When twelve years of age, the late Mr. Kennedy started farming but gave that up in 1867 when he started up in the lumber business in Ottawa. In 1877, Mr. Kennedy moved from Ottawa to New Westminster where he held many public and civic offices and was elected to the provincial legislature in 1894, holding the seat for four years. In 1904, he entered the federal arena and was Member of the House of Commons until 1908

In 1880 the late Mr. Kennedy married Miss Josephine E. DeBeck who died a few years later. In 1891 he married Mrs. Mary Adelaide Lloyd of Winnipeg. They had one


