TO START ON WALKS

Asphaltic Construction In Downtown Section To Be Proceeded With At Once

Work of constructing the new style of asphaltic sidewalks in the downtown sections will be commenced as soon as the material arrives, Mayor C. H. Orme announced this morning. The new form of construction is one that has been recommended by City Engineer F. N. Good and it is the first time that it has been tried here. Its economy is one of its principal advantages. At the same time it will be lasting, the engineer is confident.

The first sidewalks to be constructed work probably starting next Monday, will be those on the south side of Third Avenue from the Smith Block to Brooksbank Block and on the north side of Second Avenue between the Prince Rupert Hotel and Post Office. Work provided for in eight local improvement bylaws which have been passed will follow.
