

FISH LOAF-Two cups cooked fish, flaked, 1 cup soft bread crumbs, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon paprika, ½ teaspoon grated onion, 1 teaspoon lemon juice, 2 eggs, ½ cup milk, 1 tablespoon finely chopped parsley. Mix all together (more millimay be added if fish is dry). Turn into buttered mold; cover. Cook in oven or steam until firm in centre, about 1/2 hour.
