COUNCIL TAKING STEPS TO HANDLE UNEMPLOYMENT ARISING IN THE CITY

(continued from page 1)

city of additional funds being obtained.
In discussion which followed, it was pointed out that the principle was for the city to be refunded two-thirds from the governments for amounts spent in direct relief.

Ald. Collart suggested that unemployment relief work might be extended on the new road and that an appeal be made to the government with that end in view.

Mayor Orme replied that about sixty men were now employed on the road and it would be difficult to handle many more without opening a new camp. Under the appropriation, efforts were being made to carry on as much work as possible. Grading was in progress toward Cloyah Bay and this end was being surfaced.

Handling Unemployed

After City Engineer Good had requested a ruling on how the unemployed should be handled in giving out work, the suggestion seemed to be agreed upon that, for a start, say within the first two weeks, all the unemployed should be given a few days' work, the married men with families coming first and the single men next. After all had been given at least a few days work during the first two weeks, adjustment could be made on possibly a more efficient basis.

It was conceded that it would be impossible to have the same efficiency as would be the case if a regular permanent crew were on the job.

No hard and fast rule was set down by the council either as to who should receive work or in the matter of the number of days they should receive. All this, it was felt, should be handled by the engineer himself without interference on the part of the council. The aldermen, however, expressed their willingness to co-operate wherever possible. It was suggested that a conference might be held, more particularly to determine who among the applicants were really in dire need of work.

Taking some eighty men at a time, it was pointed out that it would take at least five periods of work to handle the total number of men who were already registered as being in need of work.

Ald. Linzey stated that he had heard that the government was contemplating dividing up the work on highway construction into two gangs per month, each working half a month. It would be necessary for the city to watch that men from this work did not get on city relief work. Mayor Orme stated that he had not heard that it was the intention of the government to divide up the crews.

FIRE LOSS \$1545

During the month of October, the city fire department responded to four calls, it was reported to the council last night by D. H. McDonald, fire chief. Damage totalled \$1545 all of which was done in a fire in the basement of D. E. Murphy's home on Fifth Avenue West. Expenditures of the department for the month, including salaries, amounted to \$1105. The usual inspections had been made of equipment which was found to be in good order.

City accounts for the two weeks ending November 21 and totalling \$4,098 were passed for payment at last night's council meeting.
