## Large Public Meeting Gives Tacit Approval

(Continued from Page One)

city was entitled to do its duty to the unemployed as well as other places. He favored the passing of the bylaws.

Alderman Pillsbury referred to the suggestion that Eleventh Avenue would probably be the main highway. It would be better than driving past the schools. The city owned considerable part of the property on the street. But to insure that the owners of property on that street would pay their share a local improvement bylaw was being passed assessing them about \$76 a lot for completing the work. The residents there were not getting anything free from the city.

J. M. Campbell when asked in regard to unemployment said the condition was becoming serious. He thought it would be a good thing for the city to pass the bylaws. Alderman Pullen replied to a question from Mr. Wesch in regard to the work being kept down pretty well to the estimates by saying that he council had faith in its engineer. He had made good on every work he had carried out so far.

Alderman Pullen also explained why the road to the flats had not been chosen for relief purposes. So far the agreement for the right of way had not been signed and the right to cross the railway had to be secured. In the meantime the men were hungry and must be fed.

Alderman Rudderham said the aim was to do some work of real value to the city. The cost of building Eleventh Avenue altogether under the local improvement plan was out of the question. In regard to the sewer it had to be built soon and possibly next year a bylaw would be passed providing for the putting in of the complete system in that district. The work would employ a bunch of men. The city council was not wasting anything and he believed the work would be efficiently carried out.

## Has to Provide

Alderman Collart stated that if the bylaws were not passed the city would have to provide for unemployment anyway. The men would have to be taken care of. Either they must be given a dole or employment and he thought it far better to give them work and pay them for their services. Either the work would have to be paid for next year or the bylaws providing for the cost being spread over 20 years must be passed.

Alderman Linzey reminded the meeting that unemployment was general throughout the world. The sum of \$45,000 had been applied for but only \$16,250 had been allotted to the city. He did not believe the people would turn down the bylaw but the council wanted to make sure that it would pass.

Alderman Black showed the seriousness of turning down the bylaws. It would be better to pay the men wages than to give them cash. The ratepayers had to take care of the men and their dependents. This money would be invested instead of wasted. The choice was not whether they should spend or not spend but whether they should spend it usefully or give it away.

Mr. Wesch, after hearing the speeches, thought this was the best business proposition ever put before the people. He believed the city engineer would see that the money was well spent.

John Mitchell asked in regard to the width of the street and the mayor said that before long all the streets would have to be widened.
