PRINCE GIVEN BIG RECEPTION

Observed Silent Two Minutes on Morning of Armistice Day.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 .- The Prince of Wales arrived here yesterday and was given a great ovation by the Americans. It was a fitting demonstration of the feeling of good will and friendship existing between the two great nations. Notwithstanding the full program prepared for his reception here, he insisted on observing his father's wish for a silent two minutes' tribute at 11 o'clock in commemoration of Armistice Day.

MACKENZEN ALLOWED TO RETURN HOME
