Planes Active In North Land

Pilot Joe Barrows arrived a few days ago at Whitehorse from Telegraph Creek with a Fleetster plane of the Pacific International Airways Ltd. The plane was the same one which went through the ice a few weeks ago at Sawmill Lake near Telegraph Creek but which was subsequently salvaged. Barrows had as his passenger Harry Blunt, pilot of a Fairchild plane, which crashed into a tree at Telegraph Creek the same day as the other plane went through the ice. Blunt was placed in the Whitehorse hospital for treatment of injuries sustained in the crash. Barrows was to return to Telegraph Creek to pick up Edward Lowe, president of the Pacific International Airways Ltd., and Mrs. Lowe and take them to Anchorage.

Noel Wein and Sigurd Wein, flying in a Stinson-Detroit to Nome where they plan on spending Christmas, were also at Whitehorse the same time as Barrows.

NEW AIR SERVICE

Mail to Be Carried by Plane Between Winnipeg, Minneapolis and St. Paul

OTTAWA, Dec. 24.—Approval by the cabinet council of the new air mail line between Winnipeg, Minneapolis and St. Paul was announced yesterday by Hon. Arthur Sauve, the Postmaster General.

The new service, which links the prairies with Eastern Canada, is expected to go into operation about February 1.
