

Appeal Against Police Court Liquor Sale Conviction

Dismissing the appeal of the defendant, Judge Young in County Court yesterday afternoon sustain- His Majesty as Well as Premier ed a conviction and fine of \$300 imposed by Magistrate McClymont in city police court upon Dido Gurvich for selling liquor. Gurvich said that he had no permit but that he could get the liquor for them. He sent his driver, Roy Fisher, to the vendor's and the liquor was secured.
