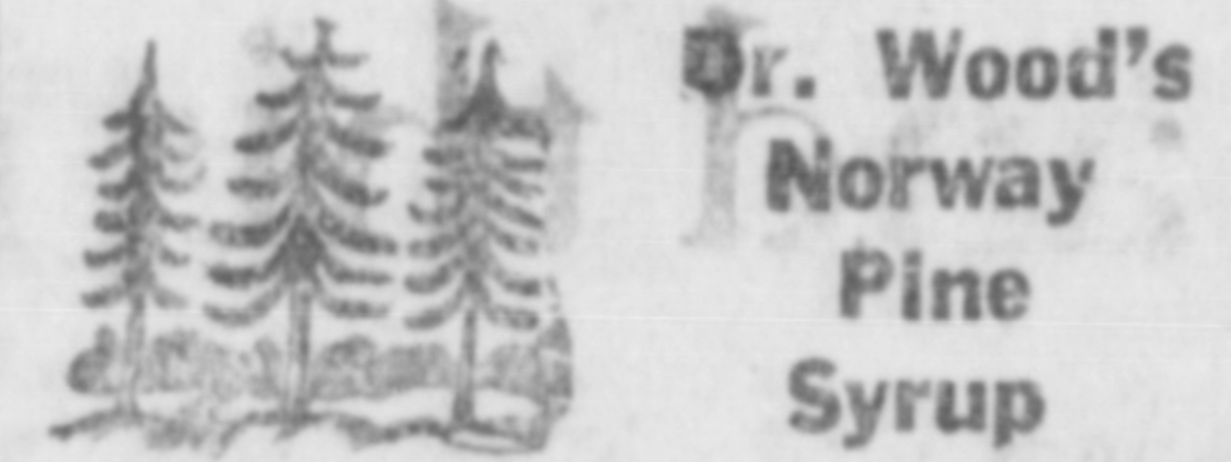

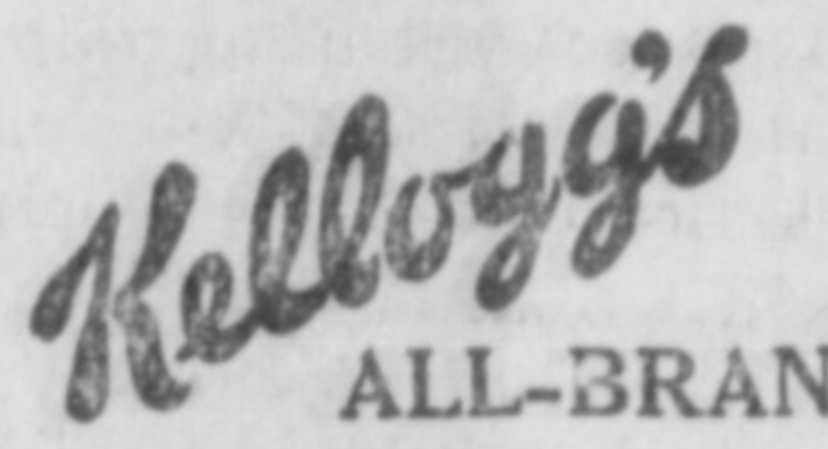

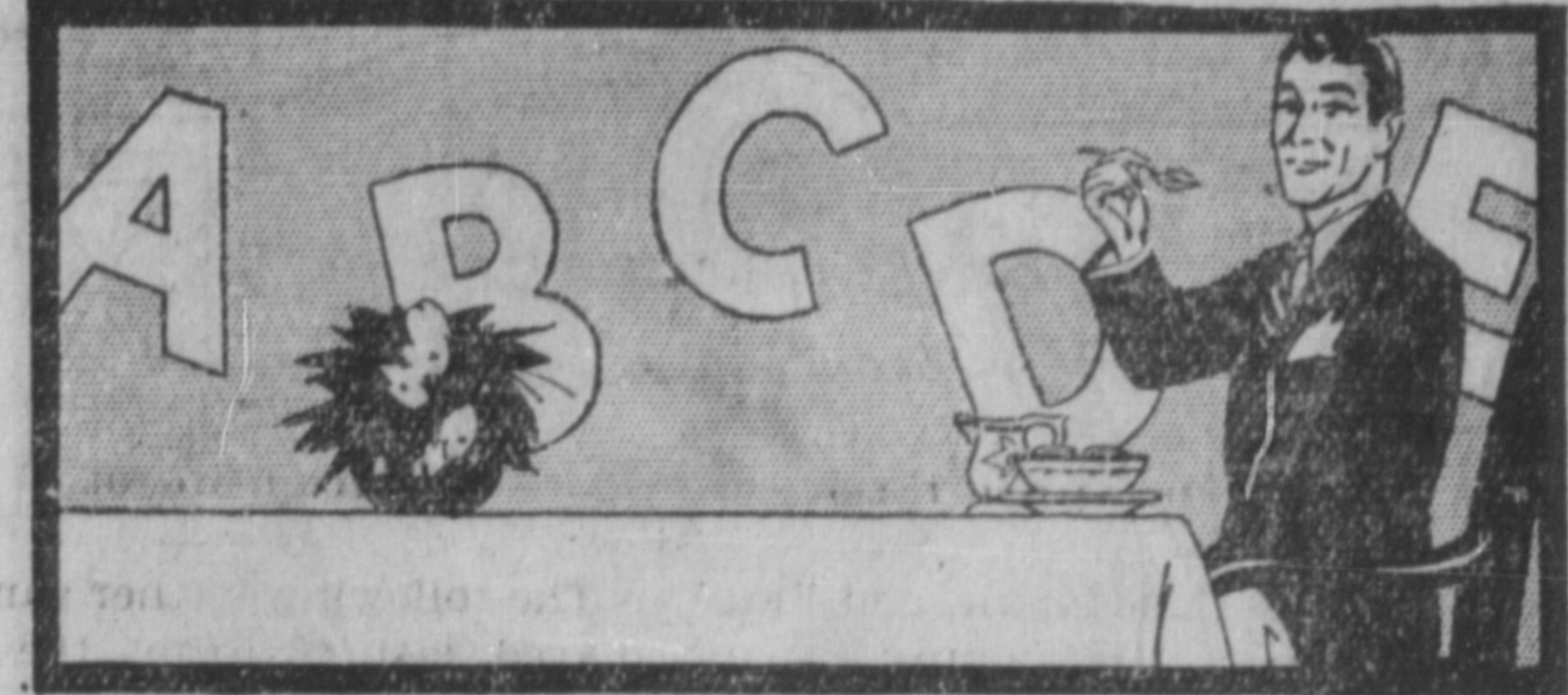
M. Dalgleish, well known pioneer resident of Atlin camp, was a passenger aboard the Princess Mary last evening bound for Vancouver, accompanied by his son, Mr. Dalgleish was one of the survivors of the steamer Islander which sank near Juneau with great loss in the Gold Rush days.

Capt. Arthur Slater, well known here as skipper of the C. P. R. steamer Princess Louise, will not be coming north again on the Skagway run, it is understood, but will take command of one of the company's new ships for the Vancouver-Victoria-Seattle run. 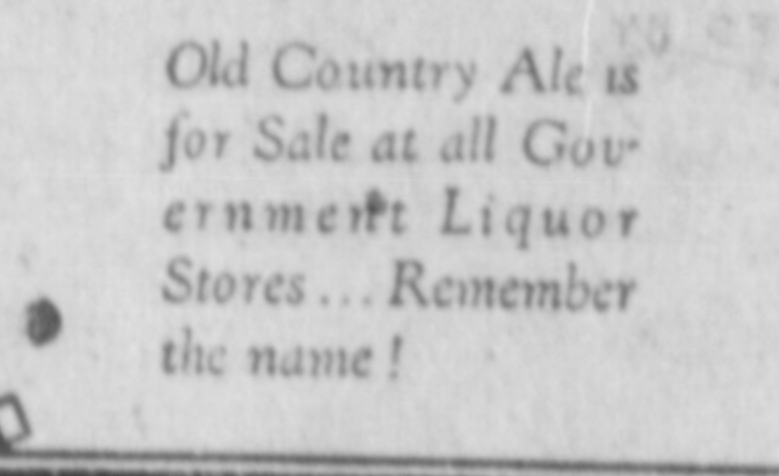
