ASSIZES COMMENCE

Light Docket Comes Before Mr. Justice D. A. McDonald at Fall Session of Supreme Court

With only two minor criminal cases and one divorce action on the docket the fall session of the Supreme Court Assizes opened here this afternoon before Mr. Justice D. A. McDonald. It is not expected that the session will take more than two days at the outside to complete.

The criminal cases are: Rex vs. Fred Capelli, charged with wounding George Bias Gustafson by stabbing on August 19 in Prince Rupert, and Rex vs. George Ness and Ernest Lewis, charged with scuttling a ship in connection with the sinking of the fishing boat C. and N. in Kitkatla Inlet on May 7 last. Milton Gonzales is conducting the defence in both cases.

Immediately after the opening of court, His Lordship instructed the Grand Jury in its duties and sent it out to consider the bills in the two criminal cases. The hearing of the divorce case is meantime being proceeded with.
