Hinchcliffe Measure To Impose Two Mills In Outside Districts

Intention Is to Make All Persons Using Schools Contribute to Payment For Same-Would Benefit Farmers

VICTORIA, March 20:-Amendments to the School Act introduced in the legislature yesterday by Hon. Joshua Hinchcliffe, minister of education, set out a new tax on personal property outside school tax districts at two mills on the dollar. The tax will also apply to personal property within school districts where a school may be closed. The purpose of the next tax is to make persons outside school districts who use schools of adjoining districts pay something toward the cost of this service. The tax is designed to cover costs of rebates to farmers as previously announced and is expected to total about \$200,000 annually.


