CAR SLIP TO BE COMPLETED THIS WEEK

Should Be in Actual Operation by December 1 or Soon After.

NINETY CAR LOADS A MONTH IS CAPACITY

The slip that has been under construction for the Whalen Pulp and Paper Company for the past two months will be completed by the end of this week. This does not mean, however, that the new system of transporting shingles, lumber and pulp will be inaugurated at once. There are still several difficulties which will delay the loading of the cars at Swanson Bay until at least December 4. The barge which is to be used for carrying the cars has not yet been fitted up for the purpose and is at present at Ocean Falls with a load of sulphur. On its return to Prince Rupert it will go into the drydock where its hull will be examined and repaired and the car tracks will be put in.

Moving Cars.

No provision has yet been made at Swanson Bay for the handling of the cars from the slip to the mill which is a distance of 700 feet. Although the slip, apron and loading platform is all in and the grade all prepared, the rails have still to be laid. In addition to that some plan for moving the cars has to be devised. On account of the tides there will be only eight hours in each day that it will be possible to move the cars onto or off the slip. From the water to the loading platform at the mill there is a grade of 7-10 per cent and a 10 per cent curve. The straight stretches are so short that it makes it impossible to use a locomotive so some other schemes are being suggested. One of these is the using of cables from a point at the intersection of the tangent lines running off each straight stretch at the two ends of the curve. The only objection to this is that there would be difficulty in spotting the cars. Another plan is the installation of a gasoline motor engine to haul the cars.

Nine Cars a Trip.

The loading platform at the mill is 380 feet long and has tracks on either side of it. The track at one side will be used for empties and on the other side for the full cars. The length at each side provides for the placing of nine cars which is the capacity of the barge. There will, thus, be no difficulty in dealing with the empty cars and the loaded ones. On the arrival of a barge with empty cars they will be pulled up on one side of the platform and the full ones immediately brought down, so no time will be spent waiting. It is expected that ten trips will be made a month and at the rate of nine cars a trip this will mean ninety carloads may be handled monthly.

Cost \$150,000.

It is estimated that the total cost of installing the new system will reach close to \$150,000, but this amount will be saved in a short time by the lessened cost of handling and shipping to say nothing of the saving that will be effected by the lessened damage which always arises with handling. It will be much more satisfactory to load shipments at the plant and have them go direct to the consignees than have them handled here as at present. Shipments will be untouched from the time they leave the big mill until they arrive at the station of the consignee.

Lessened Handling Cost.

The plan of using car ferries is an innovation in northern waters, although common in the south and east. It is anticipated that the new system will prove very successful and it is very probable that other big industrial plants in the district will follow the lead of the Whalen Company. Besides lessened cost it means quicker and more efficient delivery and handling. In every way it is advantageous to the shipper and the consignee and while it will cut down longshore work here it will, no doubt, tend to increase the amount of product passing through.

A curious coincidence is that W. E. Fisher, the well-known barrister, was one of the opposing players on the Victoria team. Mr. Fisher told a News reporter that Victoria won and Mr. Warren says that, according to his memory, Vancouver was the victor.
