O. box 68, as owner in fee under a Tax Sale Deed from the Collector of the City of Prince Rupert, bearing date the 23rd day of October, 1919, of ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying, and being in the city of Prince Rupert, more particularly known and described as Lot twenty (20), Block thirty-seven (37), section five (5), (Map 923).
You are required to contest the claim of the tax purchaser within 35 days from the date of the service of this notice, which may be effected by publication in the Daily News, Prince Rupert, B. C., and our attention is called to section 36 of the "Land Registry Act" with amendments, and to the following extract therefrom:—
