
## London Clerks Lose Bonuses

This firm alone distributed 文文 \$300,000 in bonuses amongst its tf staff last Christmas. On the Stock Exchange, 1930 is to be a lean year. The partners of several large firms, however, are contemplating the payment of bonuses out of their private fortunes to alleviate hardship among the clerks.
