Work was concentrated this year on what was known as the spar vein. This vein was stripped for several hundred feet and it was found that it connected with another vein on the north which was discovered some years ago. Samples from this latter vein are reported to have given as high as \$48.50 in gold and 31% copper per ton. Owing to the dry warm summer in the upper Kitsault country which was favorable for development in the vicinity of the glacier, it was decided to explore this vein.
