# HUNT IS DELAYED

Trouble With Exhaust Pipe Prevented Pilot Eckmann From Going North Yesterday

As Pilot Anscel Eckmann was taking off yesterday afternoon for Annette Island to continue the search there for further wreckage from Pilot Robin Renahan's plane, which is believed to have gone to the bottom thereabouts on the evening of October 28, an exhaust pipe, passing through the cabin of his (Eckmann's) plane for heating purposes, sprang a leak and started to fill the cabin with fumes. Eckmann came immediately back to his mooring at the floats of the Prince Rupert Rowing & Yacht Club to have repairs made before proceeding. Air Engineer Frank Wadman hoped to have the engine ready for today when, if weather permits, another start north will be
