## SCHEDULE FOR FALL

Steamers of Canadian National  
Fleet Soon to Give Up Summer  
Service

With the seamers Prince Rupert and Prince George providing a twice-a-week service between Prince Rupert and Vancouver and the steamer Prince John serving the entire Queen Charlotte Islands on a fortnightly basis between Prince Rupert and Vancouver, vessels of the Canadian National Steamships will revert to fall schedule next week. The fall schedule actually comes into effect from here on September 2 and will continue in effect until the middle of November when the winter schedule will be inaugurated.

The final arrival here from Vancouver under summer schedule will be that of the steamer Prince Charles on Monday next. She will proceed that evening to Stewart and Anyox, return here early Wednesday morning with excursionists for the Exhibition from those two points, leave then for Massett Inlet points and return here on Thursday to be laid up for the winter at the local dry dock.

The final sailing from here for Vancouver under summer schedule will be that of the steamer Prince George next Monday afternoon after that vessel returns from the company's final tourist sailing of the year to Skagway.

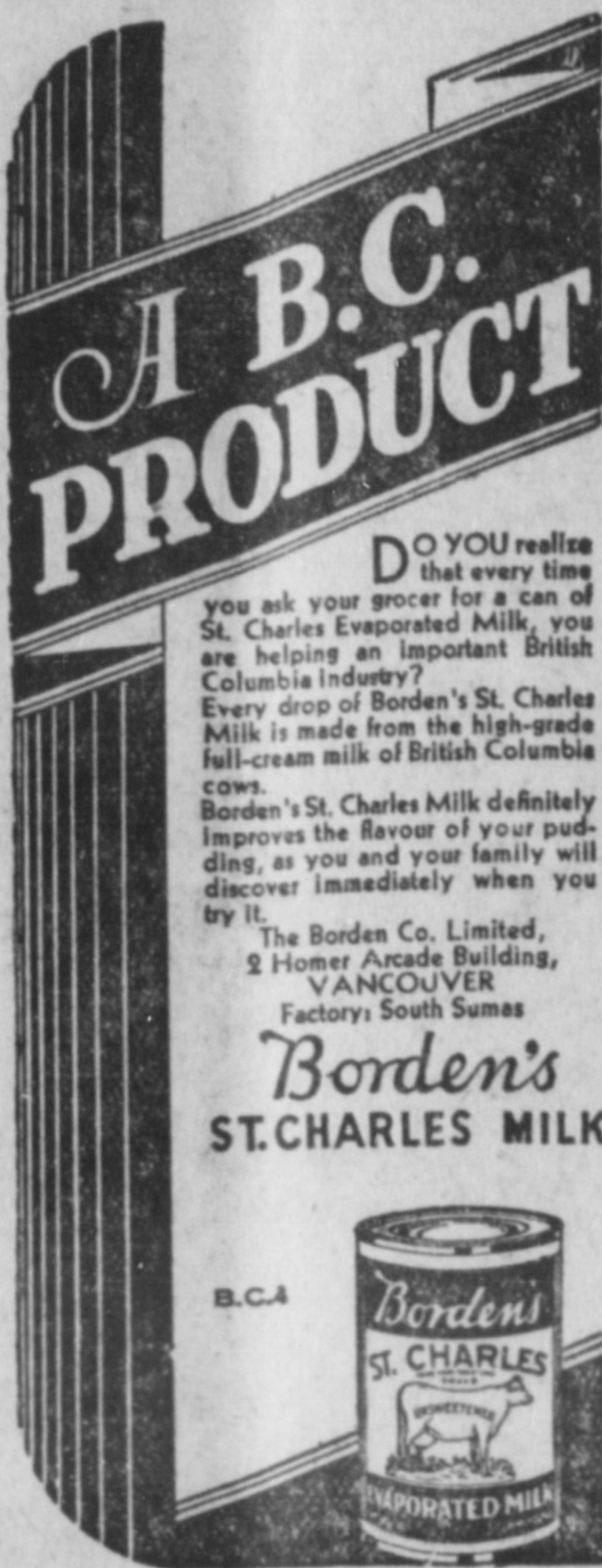
Under fall time table, the Prince Rupert and Prince George will leave Vancouver at 8 p.m. Mondays and Thursdays respectively, calling at Powell River and Ocean Falls and arriving here 10:30 Wednesday and Saturday mornings. The Prince Rupert will sail from here at 4 o'clock Wednesday afternoons for Anyox and Stewart, returning here at 8 p.m. Thursdays to sail for Ocean Falls, Powell River and Vancouver at 10 o'clock that evening. Northbound from here at 4 o'clock Saturday afternoons, the Prince George will make calls at Stewart and Ketchikan, returning here Sunday evenings at 8 o'clock and sailing for Ocean Falls, Powell River and Vancouver at 10 p.m.

The schedule calls for the Prince Rupert to arrive at Anyox 11 p.m. Wednesday and sail at midnight, reaching Stewart at 7 a.m. Thursday and sailing from there at 11 o'clock Thursday mornings. The Prince George is scheduled to arrive at Stewart at midnight Saturday, sailing early in the morning, arriving at Ketchikan at 10 a.m. Sunday and sailing from there at 12 noon.

The Prince John will inaugurate her service between Vancouver and Prince Rupert via all Queen Charlotte Islands points with the sailing from Vancouver at 4 p.m. Saturday, September 5. Northbound she will call at Alert Bay, Rose Harbor, Jedway, Lockport, Selwyn Inlet, Lagoon Bay, Sandspit, Queen Charlotte City, Massett, Port Clements and Buckley Bay, being due here Thursday mornings. 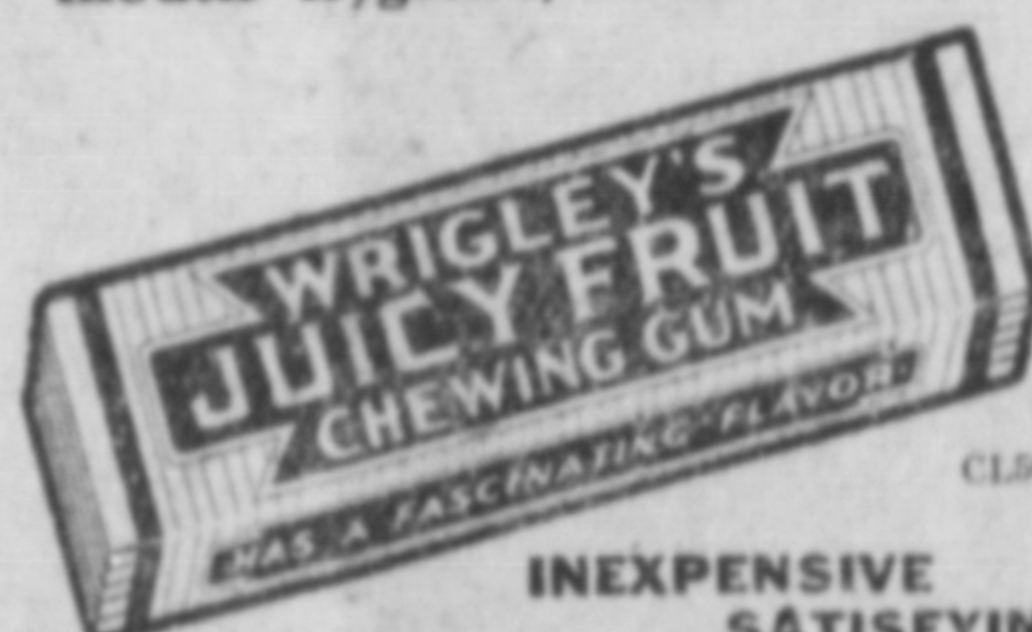
