

Conviction and Sentence to Hang Against Karl Fredericks Set Aside by Court of Appeal

Karl Fredericks, 32-year old German, who was under sentence to hang on Decembr 3 for the murder on June 12 of last year at Trembleur Lake in the northern interior of his countrymen, Max Westphal and Herman Peters, was granted a new trial by the British Columbia Court of Appeal in Vancouver re-

cently. The Court of Appeal, by majority judgment of Chief Justice J. A. Macdonald and Justices Martin, McPhillips. and M. A. Macdonald, with Mr. Justice Galliher, dissenting, set aside the verdict of guilty and ordered a new trial on the ground that an erroneous translation of a statement made by Frederick after arrest was submitted to the jury.

The new trial, it is expected, will take place at the spring session of the Supreme Court Assizes in Prince George.
