

Now that the building of one ship has at last been definitely decided upon, the directors of the Cunard Line will doubtless consider whether a contract for the construction of a second ship shall be given out. Whether the second ship will be a U sister vessel has not yet been announced, but the Cunard Company have on previous occasions favored the building of sister ships. There is much economy in this method as articles can easily be duplicated. Both Newcastle and Birkenhead have urged their claims, and there much unemployment among shipyard workers in both places.
