Nova Scotia Girl Is On English Stage

MONTREAL, August 12—Canada has a particular interest in the career of Molly Mooney, rising young star in English light opera, who is now visiting her homeland. Miss Mooney, who was born at Stellarton, N.S., went with her parents to Port Arthur, Ont., as a child, and there she began her music studies and won a scholarship which first took her to London.

In Port Arthur, after leaving school, she was employed in the offices of the Canadian National Railways. She studied music with Wilfred Coulson, F.R.C.O., and was soprano soloist with the famous Port Arthur Women's Choir and in the St. Paul's Presbyterian Church choir. In 1928, she won the Royal Academy and Royal College Associated Board scholarship, which took her to the Royal College to study under the distinguished teacher, Dr. Arnold Smith, F.R.C.M. A year later, Miss Mooney won the Lillian Eldee scholarship and began making public appearances in the British capital in concert and oratorio. Now she has won a scholarship offered by the Lyric Theatre, Hammersmith, which carries with it special study for the stage and the leading role in one of Nigel Playfair's light operas.

Miss Mooney will be heard in recital in her home city under the auspices of the Port Arthur Women's Choir. She will return to London in September.

Consul General Here Returning From Skagway

Eli E. Palmer, consul general for the United States in Vancouver, passed through the city on the Prince Henry this morning on his return south after having made the round trip to Skagway. He was accompanied by Mrs. Palmer and family.

Mr. Palmer, during his foreign service career, has seen service in the embassy at Mexico City, and at Paris, Brussels, Madrid and Bucharest. He has been consul-general at Vancouver since August, 1929.

TROLLER IS SALVAGED

Jack Hazelton and Eddie Falley Came to Assistance of Ryan Brothers in Shawatlans Passage

Swung round by the rushing tides in Shawatlans Rapids yesterday afternoon about three o'clock, the trolling boat of Eddie and Bob Ryan of Metlakatla piled up on a rock but, with the assistance of Jack Hazelton and Eddie Falley in their gill-netter, after an all-night job, the stranded boat was finally salvaged early this morning and towed to a nearby beach where she was beached.

It was about at the half of a falling tide when the Ryan boat went on the rock. About two or three hours later at 6 p.m. Hazelton and Falley came along and hove to to lend assistance. After the two brothers had been taken off the stranded boat, the latter craft was then made fast by use of lines and held during low water. At the high tide about midnight, later, the stranded boat filled but, after she came free, she was towed ashore in a submerged condition and beached.

The hull of the Ryan boat sustained little if any damage although the interior and machinery suffered because of the submerging.

ITINERANT GETS FOURTEEN DAYS' IMPRISONMENT

For being in possession of property stolen from the Canadian National Railways, Findlay Macdonald was sentenced to 14 days' imprisonment by Magistrate McClymont in city police court yesterday afternoon.
