### Scientists Aid In Taking 'Blue' Out Of 'Blue Monday'

OTTAWA, Dec. 15—Vanishing the "blue" out of "Blue Monday"—wash day—has occupied the attention of scientists to the National Research Council laboratory in the Capital.

Some time ago a laundry and textile laboratory was established at the National Research building and the problems of laundries throughout the Dominion brought under the careful investigations of chemists.

Canadians pay approximately \$20,000,000 a year to power laun-

dries, and to these the national laboratory has issued 150 reports during the past year, finding solution for many of their problems.

One important finding concerns acids. It was found that acids have no cleansing effect whatever in washing clothes. All an acid does in combination with soap is to decompose the soap and soil the clothes with the greasy scum that forms.

#### All in Russia to Build Roads

The Soviet Government plans to conscript every able-bodied peasant between the ages of 18 and 45 for six days of roadbuilding annually in Russia. No pay will given for these six days and, in addition the conscripts must provide draught animals and carts for the work.

### CEMETERIES CRITICIZED

Burying Grounds in Ontario Blot on Landscape and Disgrace to Province

TORONTO, Dec. 15.—It is true that there are hundreds of cemeteries in Ontario which are a blot on the highways and a disgrace to the province, according to Dr. J. S. McCullough, chief health officer of Ontario, speaking at the annual convention of the Ontario association of cemetery superintendents.

"On the main street of the town of Cobourg, there are two cemeteries so overrun with weeds and bramble that 100 children could be lost in each of them. One of them is Anglican and the other Catholic. Both are a disgrace. But there are worse ones. During our survey we took pictures of more than 200 of these uncared-for cemeteries, and some of them are in barnyards and overrun with cattle."

Dr. McCullough made an appeal for better care of the old cemeteries. "Ontario," he said, "owes her greatness and her prosperity to the pioneers. They were a great people, but we have sadly neglected their memory. They are lying neglected in the hillsides, in dilapidated graves which should be the beauty spots of the province. What shall we expect of our children if this is all the respect we have for the memories of our ancestors?"

### Twenty Years Ago

December 15, 1911

Ald. D. W. Morrissey inquired last night as to who would make good the deficit—the city or the engineer—if the city engineer's tender for the Woodworth Lake pipe trench cutting tender proves to be the lowest and he is unable to carry out the work for his tender.

Mr. Justice Clements has decided in Supreme Court that no liquidated damages should be charged by the city against street grading contractors who failed to complete their work within the time specified in the contracts. City Solicitor Fred Peters and City Engineer W. M. Davis are not in agreement with the judgment.

A provincial party headed by Chief Walter Owen and consisting of W. Godson, L. Dewhurst, Lionel Crippen, Sheff Thompson, Robert Hughes, Malcolm McArthur and Indian Agent C. O. Perry returned to the city last evening by gasboat from the Naas River where they went to settle disorders which had broken out among the Aiyansh Indians. An Indian and a French-Canadian were each sentenced to three months' imprisonment for the quarrel which started the disturbance. The expedition from here made the trip by foot and canoe and through ice and water.

### NEWSPAPER FILM HERE

"Five Star Final" is Stirring Melodrama Indicting Methods of Yellow Journalism

Essentially a tirade against the sensational, unscrupulous and often cruel methods of American yellow journalism and the tabloid press, "Five Star Final," first of the week offering at the Capitol Theatre, is a strong and stirring melodrama.

The story tells of the editor of such a paper who, in need of a sensational story, digs up a scandal, long-dead and forgotten, and, by his act, ruins the lives of a whole family. The story makes splendid dramatic material and the picture is swift moving and filled with action and interest. The picture is well directed and the cast is an excellent one including Edward G. Robinson, H. B. Warner, Frances Starr, Marian Marsh, Anthony Bushell and Boris Karloff.

The picture contains several symbolic touches which neither slow up the action or are overdone. The fade-out scene showing the tabloid sheet blowing in the gutter and splashed with mud is very effective.
