ROYAL ENGLISH FAMILY DURING CELEBRATIONS



Matania, the famous London Sphere artist, was one of thousands who witnessed this royal scene on Peace Day in Great Britain. The royal party went on board the state barge, glowing with crimson and gold, at the Custom House and disembarked at Cadogan Pier, Chelsea. Matania shows the moment when the royal barge is coming alongside the pier, near which a pavilion had been erected, and from which the King watched the passing of the rest of the procession. The banks of the river and the bridges were lined with dense crowds of people, who cheered loudly as the royal barge came slowly up, rowed by oarsmen in the picturesque garb of the King's Watermen. With King George were Queen Mary, Queen Alexandra, the Prince of Wales and other members of the royal family. A salute of twenty-one guns was fired as the King and Queen disembarked at Chelses

Was Worst Wind Experienced in City Since 1909 - Many Windows Broken.

Last night's furious windstorm caused considerable damage in various sections of the city, especially down town. In the outlying sections some small shacks suffered and advertising signs were blown down. Shingles were blown off roofs and some sidewalks were picked up bodily and carried away. The small house on First Ave. near the Besner Apartments, formerly occupied by Capt. Mager and family, was blown down. It had been bought by Chief Vickers and was pretty well dismantled, so the wind finished the job. Also a shack on Eighth Ave. W. went over.
