"Children of Dreams" Presents Fine Entertainment

Current attraction at the Capitol Theatre is a fine musical romance by Oscar Hammerstein II and Sigmund Romberg who have created many successful musical plays including "Desert Song," "Blossom Time," "The Student Prince," "New Moon," "Nina Rosa," "Rose Marie," "Show Boat," and "Sunny."

It is only when Molly's drunken father is robbed of the fruit-pickers' payroll-and she is forced to accept money from her benefactress-to pay her father's loss-that she consents to go abroad. She succeeds-becomes a success in opera-tires of it.

It is a beautiful story—in idyllic at apple-picking time—in New TREATMENT York, and Italy-beautiful songs and a musical setting of glamorous and haunting beauty.

The cast is well chosen. The lovers are played by Margaret Schiling and Paul Gregory, Broadway stage favorites. Gus is cleverly portrayed by nimble-footed Tom Patricola, while Molly's tiny and volatile friend Gertie is done by Marion Byron. The huge and tippling father of Molly is played by Hubert Standing, while the wise family loctor gives Charles Wininger another chance for a notable characterization.

Cannot Afford to Take Insurance

Hospital Takes No Action On Public Liability Coverage

The hospital board took the view last night that under present finncial conditions it was not justified in incurring the expense that would be involved in embarking upon a scheme of public liability in-

S. D. Johnston Co. Ltd. had a plan before the board to insure the hospital against liability in case of personal injury or death arising out of malpractice, neglect, etc. in the institution. The premium would be \$3 per year per bed and the insurance company would pay up to \$5,000 in claims on any individual patient or claims aggregating \$15,-000 in any single year.

In the case of the local hospital with its 75 beds, the total annual; premium would be \$225 and the board felt it was not justified in incurring such an expenditure under existing conditions.
