London Times And Spiritualism.

Discussing Spiritualism the London Times says editorially: "The Church Congress, debating spiritualism, and the Archbishop of Canterbury promising an inquiry into its pretensions by Bishops, were on dangerous ground. Human longing for continuity of existence beyond the grave, for communion with the dead, and for piercing through phenomena into reality is perennial. The Christian religion offers a satisfaction of its own to these cravings. But it rests its proud claim not on a utilitarian adaptation to the needs of the human heart, but on revealed truth. It is derogatory to Christian theology, and a weak tribute to the pretensions of mediums, that the vogue of spiritualism should have been discussed from a competitive standpoint. Nor, unless it be admitted that the claims of the Church and of spiritualism are of the same order, do Bishops form a suitable court of inquiry. We do not think that any special court of inquiry is necessary.


