RESCISSION PROTESTED

Liberals and Conservatives of
Islands Indignant at Cancellation
of Magistrate's Appointment

QUEEN CHARLOTTE ISLANDS, Sep. 11.—Indignation is being expressed on the Queen Charlotte Islands at the action of the provincial government in rescinding the appointment of T. R. Davey, seventy years of age and for twenty-five years a resident of the Islands, as stipendiary magistrate at Queen Charlotte City.

Caplan Davey, one of the oldest and most faithful workers on the Islands for the Conservative party, has the full support of both Conservatives and Liberals in connection with this action on the part of the government, which is felt to be most unfair. While he has always been an ardent Conservative, Capt. Davey has, however, been ever opposed to anything that might bring discredit upon his party. He lost his only two sons in the Great War.

Plans are being made to hold an indignation meeting of all residents of Skidegate Inlet to make full inquiries as to the reasons for Capt. Davey being treated in this way by his own party.
