Next week it is hoped to include as many as possible of the remaining ten.

There will be no complimentary copies delivered. A thorough revision of the lists is being made, and those not paid in advance or not paying the boys under the new ten cent a week plan are being dropped.

The boys are being instructed to call and collect from all places formerly on the list but not in good standing. If they do not call customers should notify the office. A few difficulties are bound to be experienced in getting the new system started. If customers have the change ready for one or more weeks it will make it easier for the boys.
