Former Citizen Dies for Friend

Charles E. Long Killed in Leavenworth, Wash., Making Rescue

An act of kindness to a fellow worker during the performance of duty cost Charles E. Long, a former Edmontonian, his life at Leavenworth, Wash., according to word received by C. B. Hunter of Jasper who was in Edmonton Saturday.

Drilling in a tunnel at Leavenworth, Mr. Long, who is a railroad electrical engineer, was overcome by gas after he had handed his gas mask to a worker beside him. The man was saved but Mr. Long succumbed to the fumes.

Mr. Long was past-master in one of the Edmonton Masonic lodges, and was employed some six or seven years ago by the Canadian National railways electrical department in this city. He became a member of the Jasper Park Masonic lodge a few years ago while he was employed at Jasper—Edmonton Journal.

Mr. Long was in Prince Rupert a number of years with his family.

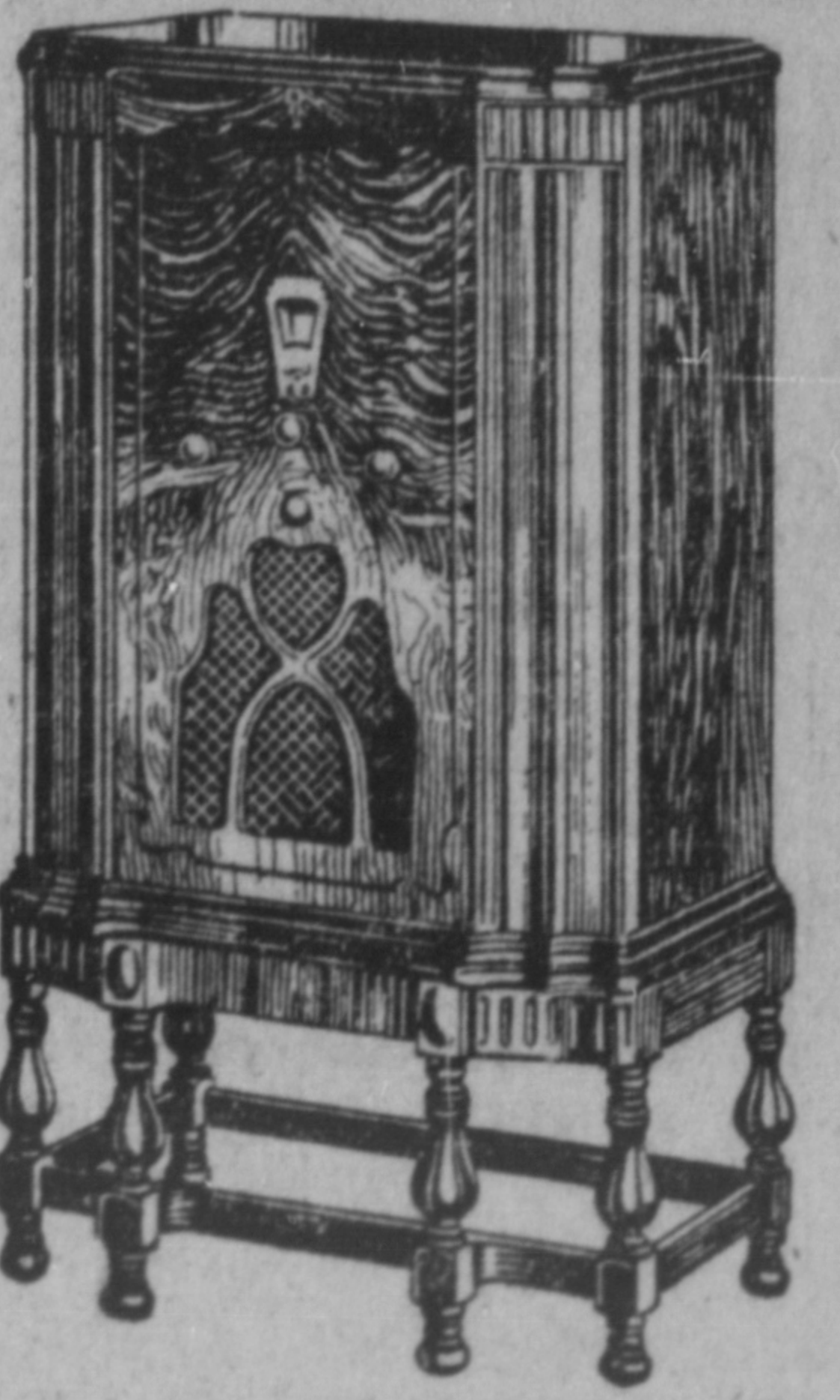
