### Vancouver Takes Undisputed Leadership of Hockey League By 2 to 1 Victory Last Night

VANCOUVER, Feb. 10.—Percy Jackson's stellar goal keeping enabled Vancouver Lions to defeat Seattle Eskimos two to one in last night's Pacific Coast Hockey League fixture and advance to an undisputed hold on first place with a two-point margin over the Eskimos. The remainder of the period was marked by end to end play. At one time Jackson had to sprawl flat down the entire width of the net to save scoring in a scrimmage in front of his goal. Jerwa played a brilliant roving game for Vancouver. Seattle made shot after shot in the third period against the Vancouver goal but Jackson saved brilliantly. Toward the close, all Seattle's five men were playing forward and doing everything to score but it was in vain and the game ended in great excitement. The Lions now have 27 points, the Eskimos, 25 and the Portland Buckaroos, 23.

Frank Jerwa, dashing right through from centre ice, scored the first goal for Vancouver within the first three seconds of play. Soon Jack Walker pulled a similar play to score for Seattle within five minutes of the start. Play was confined to second and pretty well dominated the third. Jackson made one hairbreadth save after another. It was an open game on the whole and one of the most exciting that has been seen here this season. All scoring was done in the first period.

### HANSON IS CONQUEROR

Defeated Joe Malkewicz by Technical Fall in Seattle Wrestling Bout Last Night

SEATTLE, Feb. 10.—Scoring the only fall of the eight-round bout on a technicality, Charlie Hanson won in wrestling here last night from Joe Malkewicz, his former conqueror.

It was in the early stages of the exciting match that Hanson got this fall award, the technicality being when Malkewicz threw him over the third and top rope which constitutes a foul.

Thereafter, Malkewicz pressed Hanson hard and had him groggy in the fifth round. In the sixth, however, Malkewicz was hurled out of the ropes for the count of eighteen when he struggled back. Malkewicz went out of the ropes again in the seventh for the count of ten and in the eighth for nineteen.

Before the closing gong, Malkewicz did everything in his power to score a fall but Hanson managed to elude him and carry off the decision. Both men were exhausted and staggering around the ring at the close.
