VANCOUVER, Feb. 10:-First Baptist Church, one of the finest religious edifices in Vancouver, was destroyed in a spectacular fire this morning. The loss is estimated at over \$125,000. The Sunday School hall, which was part of the structure, was saved as well as a large stone tower standing at the corner of the building. Stone walls are all that is left of the auditorium.
