Current Issue of Official Government Publication Gives Notice of Incorporation.

The current number of the British Columbia Gazette gives notice of the incorporation of the Prince Rupert Amateur Athletic Asssociation as follows:-

We, the undersigned, Michael . McCaffery, merchant; Howard . Wallace, merchant; G. Percy Tinker, agent; and William O. Fulton, solicitor, all of the City of Prince Rupert, in the Province of British Columbia, being desirous of incorporating the abovenevolent Societies Act," chapter 19, R.S.B.C., 1911, and amending Acts, declare as follows:-

1. The corporate name of the Society shall be the "Prince Rupert Amateur, Athletic Asssocia-

2: The purposes for which the Society is formed are:

(a.) The promotion and encouragement of amateur, athletics of all kinds, including the organization of a gymnasium:

(b.) For purposes of social intercourse, mutual helpfulness, mental and moral improvement, and rational recreation:


