

PARIS. April 18-King Alfonso. abdicated ruler of Spain, has reached Paris, having been brought to the French coast in a Spanish warship. Queen Victoria and her four children arrived soon after the King. They are now in residence in the royal suite in the Hotel Maurice.

It is said that Alfonso will remain in Paris until June in the hope that a mandate will be give in the general elections in Spain for him to return to Madrid King. He still maintains his right to the throne, he declared in a manifesto yesterday.
