

LARGEST LINER AGAINST HIGHEST SKYLINE.



This is what the giant new Cunarder will look like when she steams up the Hudson River against the skyline of New York on her maiden voyage in 1933. Now being built on the Clyde, "No. 534" (as she is now known) will be the largest vessel afloat, with a length of 1,018 feet, 73,000 tons gross register. She will be launched early next year. The pioneer Cunarder "Britannia" alongside is pictured in the foreground to illustrate the tremendous progress in steamship construction since 1840 when the gallant little 1,154 ton vessel inaugurated the first regular steamship service across the Atlantic.

Monster Mass Meeting of Citizens Determines to Rid New York of Gangsters

NEW YORK, Aug. 25:-At : huge mass meeting last night in Madison Square Garden, New York citizens declared war to the death upon gunmen, racketeers and bootleggers. It was one of the great outbreaks of public indignation in the history of the city, having resulted from the incident on Saturday when six persons were killed in a pitched battle on downtown streets.

FOLK QUIT FIRE TOWN

Flames Drive 700 Residents Out of Corbin in Crow's Nest Pass

None Can Enter

Railway Property is Destroyed at Nearby Section Point

FERNIE, August 25-Seven hundred inhabitants of Corbin, coal mining town, 40 miles from here, evacuated the town last evening when a forest fire borne on a hurricane swept the town.

Wye, a section point about a mile north of the main town, consisting of a number of shacks and tents and a railway roundhouse, was destroyed.

The main town was given a reprieve when the wind lessened but it was still in peril and so smokeladen that none can enter.

Women and children are encamped six miles from the danger zone at Cold Spring while men and boys are enlisted to fight the flames.
