Gyro Club Hears L. S. McGill in Interesting Lantern Lecture

Highly interesting and very unique was an address given before the Prince Rupert Gyro Club at luncheon yesterday by L. S. McGill, prominent barrister and mining man. Instead of making a stereotype speech, Mr. McGill took his listeners by magic lantern on a tour of Central British Columbia and showed them many interesting scenes and spots in that vast empire which the speaker described as being as large as England and with quite as great possibilities. Agricultural, lumbering, mining as well as straight scenic views were among those offered by the speaker. Even to many who might have thought themselves quite familiar with the Bulkley Valley, the pictures proved a great revelation.

In his opening remarks, Mr. Mc-Gill declared that the development of the city of Prince Rupert and the Warriage of Wiss hinterland in the interior would ever go hand in hand. 
