### Terrace Man Not Guilty of Keeping Liquor For Sale

TERRACE, May 20.—Before Magistrate Kenney on Monday L. Chretien was summoned on a charge of keeping beer in his house for sale.

Constable McKenney told the court that he had seen two men leave the defendant's place under the influence of liquor and, when he spoke to them, they told him they had had a drink with Chretien. As a result he obtained a warrant and searched the premises on

which he found 299 bottles containing beer.

Under cross-examination he admitted that he judged the contents of the bottles was beer because of its appearance and smell.

For the defence several witnesses were produced, all of whom stated that they had had drinks with Chretien at his home as friends but that they had never paid for the drink and had never been asked to pay.

Defendant stated that he made the decoction himself because he found it cheaper than tea or coffee, and that now and again he shared it with his friends.

The defendant was adjudged not guilty and the prosecution gave notice of appeal.
