WAS FIRST B.C. MOTHER

Bodies of Mother and Babe in Nameless Grave On Queen Charlotte Islands

In a nameless grave on a hillside of the Queen Charlottes was found the skeleton of a young mother and her new-born babe—the first white mother of whom there is any trace in British Columbia.

According to N. de Bertrand Lugin, who tells her story in "Pioneer Women of Vancouver Island," she came to the Pacific Coast more than 150 years ago. A fur trader's ship, overtaking a sinking vessel, found only two persons left alive—the captain and his beautiful daughter.

"The father died soon after, leaving his child in the care of the master of the rescued vessel," wrote Miss Lugin, "who had promptly become enamoured of her and urged his suit. But she was very young and the thought of mating with a man of middle age was repugnant to her. Besides, the gallant and handsome second officer was also very much in love with her, and he was little more than a lad."

The story goes on to tell how the cruel captain got his revenge by thrusting the young girl and her lover out on the North Pacific in an open boat. Weather proved kind to them, and they eventually drifted ashore on the Queen Charlotte Islands, where the Indians took the fair-haired girl for a goddess.

For a time she moved about among the Indians, helping to nurse their sick and care for their children, but when her own baby was born she died. Such is the legend of the first white mother to come to this coast.

ALICE ARM, May 20.—J. Strombeck, a pioneer prospector of the Alice Arm district, has freighted supplies over the Dolly Varden railway for transportation to the upper Moose property in the Upper Kit-sault country. PAMPHLET WAS HOAX

Document Regarding English Boys Coming Here Believed to Have Been Practical Joke

Recently there was circulated around the city a pamphlet which purported to be supporting a campaign for the bringing in of 30,000 boys from England to take the jobs of Canadians. The following from Vancouver Sun in regard to same is of interest:

A hoax perpetrated by an unknown Vancouver resident caused a stir in the Trades and Labor Congress in Toronto last night.

To the congress was read a pamphlet, purporting to be issued by "J. T. Brown, Canada Hall, 1640 Alberni Street," and urging that 30,000 English public school boys be placed in Canada in preference to Canadian-born boys.

There is no "J. T. Brown" and no "Canada Hall" at that address. The city directory lists Nielson Gilbert, card writer, as the occupant of 1640 Alberni.

The Vancouver Sun learned that the pamphlet was prepared and issued as a species of practical joke.

CREDIT BUREAU

The chief matter of discussion at the dinner meeting of Prince Rupert Retail Merchants' Association was the proposed establishment in the city of a retail merchants' credit information bureau. A committee was appointed to go more fully into plans for such an establishment and to recommend action at the next monthly meeting.

Inspired by recent burglaries, there was also discussion of the policing of the city during the early morning period. It was decided to interview the chief of police to ascertain if it would not be possible to have more men on after 3 a.m.

The dinner was presided over by John Bulger, the president, and there was a good attendance of members.
