## LIGHTING OF FISH FLOATS

Reason of Delay Is Explained—Railway Commission Here This Week

Alderman S. D. Macdonald explained at last night's meeting of the city council why the new fishermen's floats had been made some time ago whereby the federal government would carry out the necessary installations while the city provided the light free of charge. There had been some misunderstanding as to just how far the government was to carry the light and, because of this, nothing had yet been done. The council agreed that the mayor should get in touch with the department by wire, urging the advisability of having the work carried out at once.

The council also received notification from the Board of Railway Commissioners that that tribunal would hold a session here on Thursday morning of this week in connection with the application for a level crossing for a roadway to lead to the floats. There had been no opposition entered against the proposed crossing.
